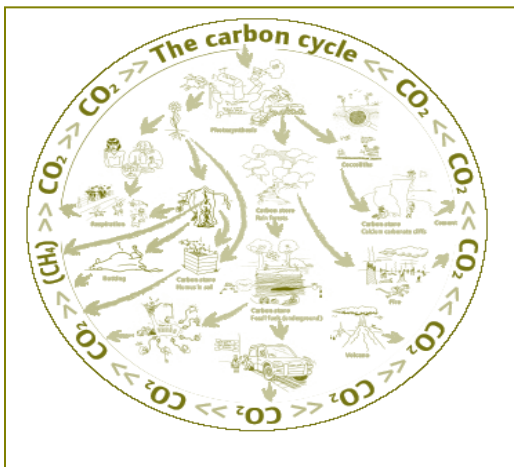


Fusion, Science and Art

In September 2005 Eden's iconic new Education Centre, The Core, was opened to the public for the first time. On display are a series of stunning ceramic mosaics produced by young people from seven Cornish secondary schools.

The mosaics are the result of an exciting collaborative project between artists, scientists, architects, designers, contractors, seven Cornish schools and the Eden Team, facilitated by a partnership with Creative Partnerships Cornwall & Plymouth.

This poster details the background to this project which involved cross-curricular and partnership working. The finished artefacts are now on display in the Core, taking their place alongside works by world class artists and makers such as Peter Randall Page and Engineered Arts.
