Why I'm rare: I've had trouble finding a safe place to live. A lot of the habitat where I grow best has been destroyed, and I'm often dug up illegally and sold so that people can plant me in their gardens.

My story: When a dam flooded my habitat, botanic gardens rescued me and helped my find a new home. They also learned how to grown me from seeds, so I don't have to be dug up to be sold as a garden plant.
