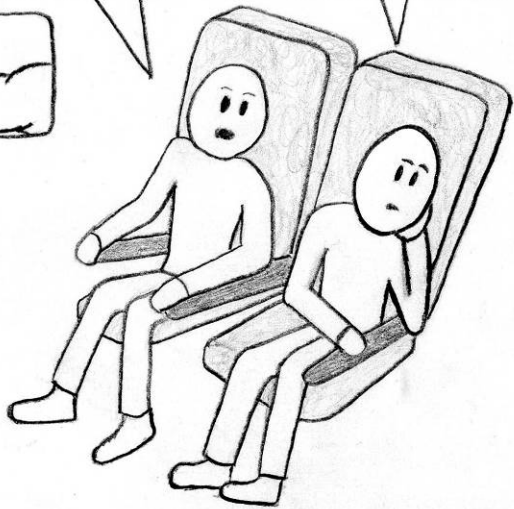
Alpine trees.
