

- Lack of integration of greenhouses with associated buildings for improved energy management
- Lack of leadership and investment for low-carbon-footprint greenhouses

SEVEN STEPS TO GREENING OUR GREENHOUSE

- Improve glazing design to reduce energy demand by 50% compared to a conventional greenhouse
- o Integrate the greenhouse with associated buildings for improved energy management
- Utilise the greenhouse to capture solar energy
- o Store excess heat underground in a Vertical Soil Heat Exchanger (VSHE)
- Heat the integrated buildings during colder periods using the stored energy
- Use renewable biomass energy from local sources for back-up/peak demand
- o Use the Green Greenhouse to inspire and educate greenhouse growers and the public

- O To complete the transformation of The Living Rainforest centre into a working demonstration of carbon-neutral design and practice
- o To raise the remaining 25% matched funding required to complete the second phase of construction of the EC Integrated Greenhouse Project (Life 05/ENV/UK/000998)
- o To promote carbon-neutral greenhouse horticulture
- o To lead the way in educating the public about greener greenhouse design
