- The title of the paper centered with bold capital letters (14 font Times New Roman)
- Name of the author(s) centered in bold (12 font Times New Roman)
- Address(es) of the authors / organization should be clearly mentioned along with Phone, fax and e.mail etc
- Author for correspondence should be specifically mentioned
- A 500 word abstract must contain precise informstion of the paper
