

Mulanje Cedar

(Widdringtonia whytei)

About me: I am Malawi's national tree and I only grow on the top of Mulanje Mountain. My wood is termite proof and very hard-wearing which has made it very popular for building houses, making furniture and wood carving.

Why I'm rare: As a result of over-exploitation and damage from forest fires I am now listed as **Critically Endangered** on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species and at risk of becoming extinct in the wild if urgent action is not taken to save me.

Taking action: The Global Trees Campaign is working with partners in Malawi and the UK to replant Mulanje Cedar on Mulanje Mountain. Community nurseries have been set up at the base of the mountain to grow thousands of Mulanje Cedar seedlings to restore populations on Mulanje Mountain.
