Wâc fach bum munud o'r Bloc Stablau.

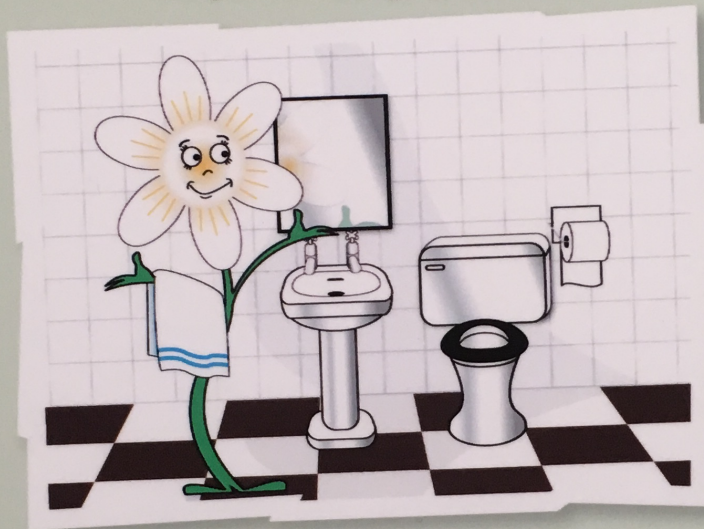
