

Material Transfer Agreement for the Living Collections Cytundeb Trosglwyddo Deunydd ar Gyfer y Casgliad Byw

The National Botanic Garden of Wales ('NBG Wales') is committed to the letter and spirit of the Convention on Biological Diversity (1992) and the associated Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization (2010). As a botanic garden based in the United Kingdom, we also operate within the framework of the Regulation (EU) No. 511/2014 and the Nagoya Protocol (Compliance) Regulations 2015/821.

NBG Wales will supply plant materials¹ from the living collections to partner organizations or individuals subject to the following conditions being met:

- i. Plant materials are used for the common good of scientific research, conservation, education and/or engagement of the public.
- Plant materials are supplied on the basis that it is used for non-development² purposes only.
 Commercialisation or utilisation³ of supplied plant materials can only occur if permission from NBG Wales and all other relevant parties is granted.
- iii. NBG Wales must be acknowledged as the source of the plant materials when used in published scientific studies and reports.
- iv. NBG Wales cannot guarantee materials are viable, verified or pathogen free and accepts no liabilities.
- v. Appropriate measures are taken to record the accession number(s) provided, maintain high standards of documentation and care for plant materials supplied.
- vi. NBG Wales reserve the right to refuse, without explanation if necessary, the supply of further plant materials.

Definitions:

^{1.} Plant materials: living plants, seeds, spores and their progeny and derivatives.

^{2.} Development: Work directed towards the innovation, introduction or improvement of a product

^{3.} Utilisation: Conduct research and development on the genetic and/or biochemical composition of a genetic resource
